A Message from the Library Director

2013 is an opportune time to act for those who believe in the value and importance of libraries as well as in the power of the ballot box.

There are forces at work right now in the California State Legislature. Certain members have a vision as well as a specific plan to

make it easier for voters to support local special taxes and bonds for construction by reducing needed voter approval from a two-thirds majority to 55%. Senator Lois Wolk (D-Davis) has introduced SCA-7, and it looks like other similar measures are being proposed to change how we as voters may choose to support our local institutions.

For SCA 7 to become a reality, it will need to pass both houses of the legislature (by a 2/3rds vote in each house) and be signed by Governor Brown. It would then be placed on the November 2014 statewide ballot, where a majority of the statewide electorate would need to vote in favor of it. If successful, all cities, counties, and special districts would have the authority to place a special tax for library operations and/or a library construction bond on their local ballots. Voters would thus have the opportunity to support sustainable funding for their community anchor—the public library.

Whether or not SCA-7 actually wins passage, the truly interesting thing is that the process to get it passed is helping all of us engage in a conversation about what services we are willing to support and what those services mean to us.

Meet the Friends: Joanne Murphy

Joanne is the Friends' resident bookbinder and restorer. For the past two years, she has been repairing problems both small and large that she detects in our older and more eclectic books. Many of these restored books are stars at the bi-annual Sacramento Antiquarian Book Fair. Recently Joanne restored a Bible that was dedicated to Branch Rickey and signed by the 1953 Pittsburgh Pirates!

Joanne became interested in book repair and binding about two years ago. She likes sewing and needlecrafts, so the detail-oriented aspect of book repair intrigued her. She took a course in book repair and developed a friendship with Pat Bruno, a local bookbinder. "After thirty years in book binding, Pat knows all the tricks," says Joanne. Working together weekly, Pat helped set up Joanne's own book repair shop, a gift from her husband last spring.

Repairing books requires a keen eye for detail and a lot of ingenuity. It is important to match the original materials as closely as possible. To that end, Joanne has used not only conventional products, but also things like tin foil and a corner from a box of waxed paper that happened to be just the right color. To match the different patterns of ink on speckled or mottled covers, she uses cotton balls, toothbrushes, and sponges. Often books contain surprising treasures within. When repairing covers, Joanne has found them stuffed and padded with all kinds of old documents, including old handbills, maps, and sheet music.

Joanne has had a lengthy career as a doctor specializing in emergency care. She says repairing books isn't that much different than repairing people. "I used to put people back together, and now I put books back together - same thing! It's just a book, and it doesn't complain, it doesn't threaten to sue you; it just sits there quietly and lets you work on it. But it involves the same kind of technicality that I liked."

Joanne's skills bring new life to books, providing a unique source of income to the Friends. The recently restored Bible now has a value of approximately \$600, while sales from the Antiquarian Book Fair average around \$2500 per day. Most important, Joanne's patient work turns books that often appear to be permanently damaged into precious and often valuable works of art again.


